Use this Prayer Prompt

STUDY THE BIBLE

Think through and discuss your reactions as you read through Scripture:

- Revelation 21:1–5
- Romans 8:18–25
- 2 Peter 3:10–13

STIR UP DISCUSSION

How does this week's teaching affect me personally?

1. What stood out to you most from this teaching on Revelation?
2. Why do you think people become so fascinated or obsessed with end-times theories?
3. What does it mean that God is making a “new heaven and new earth” rather than abandoning creation?
4. What do you think the sermon meant by saying Revelation is meant to “steady us” rather than scare us?
5. How can the message of Revelation help you respond differently to bad news, cultural chaos, or uncertainty?
6. How does Revelation challenge the idea that suffering has the final word?

7. How can you cooperate with God's renewing work instead of resisting it?

STEP INTO ACTION

Let's try to apply this by taking some Next Steps.

This week, intentionally live with eternity in mind.

Choose one practical way to focus on God's renewal instead of fear or despair:

- spend intentional time in prayer each day
- limit anxious doom-scrolling or obsession with negative news
- encourage someone who is suffering
- worship instead of worrying
- reflect on God's promises in Revelation 21
- practice gratitude for signs of God's renewal already happening around you

Whenever anxiety or fear rises this week, remind yourself:

"I know how the story ends."
